Please understand that there is some risk in attending Riverbend's Summer Camp. As a camp community, we rely on our families to be honest, keep sick children home, and do our best not to spread infection.

COVID-19

- Campers should stay home if they have COVID-19 symptoms, have been diagnosed with COVID-19, are waiting for COVID-19 tests results, or have been exposed to someone with symptoms or a confirmed or suspected case.
- If a camper exhibits any signs or symptoms of illness prior to drop-off, DO NOT send them to Riverbend.
- We encourage all campers and counselors who are eligible to be fully vaccinated prior to the start of camp.
- Masking at Riverbend is optional indoors and outdoors.
- There will be approved hand sanitizer available in the Snider Barn, Laurie Bachman Farmhouse and Nick and Dee Adams Pavilion
